<u>Special Sermon on September 22, 2024, based on this article from August.</u> What are we Striving for?

This past week Catherine and I met with Pastor Pierce and Mark Kruse from Campus to discuss our shared partnership with Campus Lutheran. As most of you know, our agreement with campus was originally for 3 years, and now that we have officially started the third and final year of this original agreement, we met to discuss what our relationship looks like going forward. Both Campus Lutheran and Good Shepherd are in agreement that we wish for our congregations to continue partnering in shared ministry together, even after this original 3-year agreement is up, and the shared ministry grant is no longer available to us. With this in mind, we met to re-evaluate our Memorandum of Understanding, which is our original agreement, and to adjust some of the language in it to help us better clarify what it is we are striving for, and what we hope to accomplish as two congregations working together as part of the one Church.

After the meeting, I got thinking about something; we had talked about what Campus Lutheran and Good Shepherd were striving to do together (something that we are still trying to put words); but what about Good Shepherd herself? What are we striving for? Now, there is no shortage of dedication and hard work here, at least not from what I can see; since being called to be your pastor here at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, I have come to recognize that it is full of many people that care a lot about it, who give generously of their time, effort, and resources. I have also noticed that those who do so carry a burden of worry and concern for the well-being of this congregation and her continuation, and that this burden has left many here tired, worn, and maybe even discouraged. But let me encourage you with something else I see, a congregation where the report from visitors is that we are warm and welcoming; where a visitor wanders into our doors thinking we are the church next door, and yet ends up staying because he feels like he belongs here. This is a church where Christ is still at work, so take heart and hear these words of encouragement He has for you.

<u>**31</u>**Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' <u>**32**</u>For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. <u>**33**</u>But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.</u>

Christ still has a mission and a purpose for this church and I want everyone here to know this and take it to heart.

Finally, I end this brief word with a question, one I want everyone to think about carefully and answer in about a month from now when I give a special sermon over it. This is not a rhetorical question, nor is it accusatory or critical of Good Shepherd; if anything, you could say this is meant to encourage and motivate, for this is a sincere question made in good faith.

My question is this: Good shepherd is a valued and important part of this community and should be for years to come because . . ..

#### Update from GSLC's Summer Student Worker at Campus
